




Thank you for your generosity this season

y name is Savannah. I can honestly say God has made me a changed person. If I had not come to Chattanooga Rescue Mission to get my life back together, I would either be in jail or dead. That's how bad my addiction was to prescription drugs. Since age 14 I have been medicating myself. Starting at that young age, because of a bad back, I was given every kind of pill, muscle relaxant and nasal spray imaginable. All that added up to a life of addiction. One day my husband said to me, "Savannah, you have to get help or this marriage is not going to make it." I knew he was right. It wasn't long before God directed my steps to Chattanooga Rescue Mission — where my transformation began. Here I'm learning to read the Bible, I'm praying, and the chapel services
